outplayed the German Emperor. It was a major success in diplomacy for Nicholas II.

Troshin N. N. The first experience of implementing the system of economic reform in Tsarist Russia (M. M. Speransky's Financial Plan of 1810–1812)

Exacerbated by the end of 1809, Russia's economic problems were caused by an unbalanced budget and financing deficit by means of issuing paper money, which has led to the devaluation of the rouble. A programme of financial reforms was prepared under the direction of M. Speransky. He proposed a number of interrelated reforms aimed at establishing a modern financial system in Russia. However, deviations from the original plan in the course of the reforms' implementation between 1810 and 1812 prevented the rouble from stabilising.
